Winter is almost over and spring is around the corner. Water conservation should be on everyone's mind. We are going into this year with limited rainfall over the last few months.

Water levels are still holding quite steady for the most part. The northern part of the district Runnels county is very slowly dropping. It needs some good general rains over much of it to get it back into recharging. Concho county is showing pretty steady with a slow drop in pasture wells.

We are starting to have more wheat watering going on. This trend should continue until we have some good rains. Wells around irrigated winter wheat are showing the effects of pumping with drops of a few feet. Tom Green and some of the other irrigated areas show a slight increase in water levels if no irrigated wheat fields are close by.
