It has been a busy start to the new year. The cotton crop has been harvested and ginned. The state legislature has started their session for this year. Here at the office we are working on gathering and arranging data for year end reports.

Water levels readings were fairly steady over most of the district. Most of the water level readings were within 2 ft of last months readings. The general trend was up for the south side of the district and lower on the north side. I have noticed in some creeks that a few springs are starting to flow. We would be in great shape if we could get a couple of inches of rain in the next few weeks.

Runnels and Concho county water levels in shallow wells in the nonirrigated areas are going down slowly. Levels will continue to drop a few inches a month till we get a rain.

Southern Tom Green south of the Concho river is slowly filling in most areas. Water levels rose from a few inches to 2 ft except near irrigated wheat land.
